



POCATELLO FIELD ARCHERS

Members of Pocatello Field Archers and their guests are expected to observe the following:

- Safe behavior is absolutely required. If you are new to archery and need an explanation of range safety rules, please ask your fellow members or a PFA board member. They will be happy to explain them.
- Help keep the facilities clean and orderly. There is no janitorial staff – all cleaning is done by volunteer PFA members. Put things back where they belong. Clean up after yourself.
- Do not abuse the ranges, facilities or PFA equipment.
- Lock gates as you enter and leave. Ensure the indoor range door is fully closed.
- No broadheads on any of the ranges, except specially-designated outdoor broadhead targets.
- Use minimum lighting at the indoor range to keep power usage down. Turn off lights and other electrical equipment (e.g., radios, etc.) when you leave.
- For safety, keep any children under your care from climbing on tables, bleachers, bow racks and other obviously unsafe places.
- Participate in scheduled work parties when you can. PFA's facilities require a significant amount of maintenance, all of it done by volunteers.
- Refrain from drinking alcohol before and during shooting.

- Exhibit courtesy to fellow shooters at all times:
 - The 20-yard line at the indoor range has precedence. You may shoot the 30-yard and 40-yard marks only when no other shooters are using the range, or with their permission. All other shooters must be behind you when you shoot from the 30-yard and 40-yard marks.
 - Do not monopolize the tabletops at the indoor range shooting lines with bow cases, coats and other bulky items. Your fellow shooters often need a place to sit and make adjustments on their bows, or simply take a break from shooting. Place such items in the front part of the range facility.
 - Do not stop and hold conversations inside the 20-yard mark when other members are waiting to shoot.
 - Keep your language appropriate to the company present.
 - Do not rush your fellow shooters. Good archery is a game of concentration and control. We have many professional and serious amateur archers using the PFA's indoor range. Their pace may be slower than yours.
 - If you have children with you, they are your responsibility. Do not allow them to be disruptive of a safe and pleasant shooting environment. If you are not keeping your children under reasonable control and a fellow PFA member asks you to do so, be courteous and respond positively to the request.

The Pocatello Field Archers board of directors and officers may suspend or expel any member whose conduct is not consistent with the commonsense dictates of courteous, safe and honest behavior. A suspended member may see reinstatement through a vote of the board of directors.
